From this locality, the gneiss continues in a southwesterly direction, keeping from one-eighth to three-eighths of a mile northwest of the road leading from Jacksonville to Beaver Dam Creek, the drift still bounding it for a distance of about two and a half miles southwest of the conglomerate above mentioned. At this place the gneiss comes in contact with trap (melaphyre), which continues with the line of the gneiss for a distance of about three hundred yards; this melaphyre is composed of labrador-feldspar and pyroxene; it is exceedingly hard, having a structure from finely granular to massive. It contains geodes of quartz, zeolites, etc. The line of the gneiss continues on to the southwest, bounded by the drift, except at one locality, about three-eighths of a mile from the trap just spoken of, where conglomerate very similar to that already described, but of...



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
